<u>Remembering Nichelle Nichols</u> 12/28/32-7/30/22

I still remember watching and listening to Nichelle Nichols sing the Star Trek theme, and another song, "Beyond Antares," at a small Star Trek convention at the Hotel John Marshall, downtown Richmond, Virginia, in the summer of 1976. Her singing was wonderful, and I wish my undiagnosed, untreated ADD had allowed me to focus more on her.

She was beautiful, and nice. I didn't try to speak with her, because I was shy, had some idea how socially clumsy I was, and thought she probably had all the attention she could handle.

I had way too little money for the dealer's room, which struck me as weird and somewhat opportunistic. One dealer was selling sheets of shiny, reflective, rainbow swirly. My convention highlight was seeing a short, maybe 5-minute gag reel of out-takes from the original series.

The convention hadn't attracted enough attendees and held an auction on the last day, trying to get enough money just to break even. I know Ms. Nichols did her part, but I couldn't afford her. I gave what little I could. I didn't have a summer job, not having a car (until I was 26).

That was the one and only time central Virginia has had a Star Trek convention. It's one of the reasons I made up my mind to help any local event, and I've been a volunteer staffer for local fan conventions for over 20 years.

In the last few years, Ms. Nichols came to Richmond for another convention, one that's mostly meet and greet and photo ops. Friends, a couple with whom I've been in tabletop RPGs since December 1996, got their picture taken with Ms. Nichols. They have the photo framed, on a wall in their living room. It's great to see it. RADM Lowell Whitaker:

I had the honor of meeting her at one convention in 1998. This was back when my old Role-playing group was on good terms and one year before my friend home burned down taking with it 90% of our gaming stuff for which as hard as we tried, we never recovered and ended a few years later 2002.

The event was a smaller group named Slanted Fedora which sadly went out of business years later due to financial issues and lawsuits by fans, but at the time they held a good event in Charleston WV. This was back when the USS West Virginia was a chapter and Excelsior class. We drove to WV that Saturday and did it one day. Among the guests were James Doohan, Nichelle Nichols, George Takei and Walter Koenig.

Then the big event was the Q&A with the TOS members, and Walter, George and Nichelle made their way to the stage. Nichelle had hurt her ankle, yet she still wanted to come, and Walter helped her around. and you can tell they loved the fans. And when it came to autograph time, you could tell Nichelle was in pain yet she remained cheerful as I walked up to her and got my pic signed, "HI Honey!" That few seconds means a lot now.

Later on, there was a dinner with the stars, and most of the group wanted to go to the mall which was across the street. They left me and did that while I got to get pics with Walter, Steven and George. Sadly Nichelle was in the room resting which we understood. I could stay longer yet we had a long drive so I departed, and met them at the mall, and we returned to KY. We had planned to do it in 1999 yet our RPG CO lost his home sadly. I went by myself with Brother and his wife. That's another story.

"But if you are here, then how can you celebrate a feast?" R'u'an asked.


