Cooking with Neelix Asparagus Casserole





- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, divided
- 1/2 cup panko breadcrumbs, preferably whole-wheat
- 3 pounds asparagus, trimmed and cut into 2-inch pieces
- 1 tablespoon garlic, finely chopped
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups whole milk
- 5 ounces cream cheese
- 1/2 cup part-skim mozzarella cheese, shredded
- 1 teaspoon salt
- -Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F.
- -Bring a large pot of water to a boil over high heat.
- -Set a large bowl of ice water near the stove.
- -Melt 1 tablespoon of the butter in a small microwave-safe bowl in the microwave, about 30 seconds.
- -Stir the panko breadcrumbs into the melted butter.
- -Cook the asparagus in the boiling water until they are bright green, about 1 minute.
- -Drain the asparagus and transfer them to the ice bath to shock them.
- -Let the asparagus cool for 5 minutes before draining and patting them dry.
- -Arrange the asparagus in a 9x13-inch baking dish.
- -Heat the now-empty pot over medium-high heat.
- -Add the remaining butter to the pot and stir until it has melted.
- -Add the garlic to the butter and cook, stirring, until it is fragrant, about 1 minute.
- -Add the flour to the butter mixture and cook, while stirring, for 30 seconds.
- -Gradually whisk the milk into the mixture and bring it to a boil, while whisking constantly.
- -Continue cooking and whisking the mixture until it thickens, about 5 minutes.
- -Transfer the pot from the heat and stir in the cream cheese, the mozzarella, and the salt.
- -Pour the cheese sauce over the asparagus and stir to coat.
- -Sprinkle the panko breadcrumb mixture on top of the asparagus mixture.
- -Bake until the asparagus are tender, about 12-15 minutes.

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


Exclusive: Henry Cavill Eyed For Star Trek 4



Kal-El may have stayed on Earth, but if Paramount has its way, *Man of Steel*'s star will be making it back to the stars. Our <u>trusted and proven sources</u> tell us the studio wants Henry Cavill for the long-delayed *Star Trek 4*. We don't yet know exactly who the former <u>DC Studios</u> star would play in the Kelvinverse flick, but we have at least one very intriguing thought on that score.

Henry Cavill's time as Superman and as *The Witcher*'s Geralt of Rivia has most of us thinking of him as a good guy, but for *Star Trek 4* we're thinking <u>Paramount</u> wants him as the bad guy. Trek has a long history of actors delivering stand-out performances in their films, even in the not quite as well regarded movie entries; e.g. F. Murray Abraham in *Star Trek: Insurrection*, Tom Hardy in *Star Trek: Nemesis*, and Malcolm McDowell in *Star Trek: Generations*. Not to mention that, assuming the Kelvinverse flicks mean to stick to the same crew as the original series, there's really no one left for him to play in the Enterprise's senior crew.

Star Trek Composer Gerald Fried Dies at 95



FEBRUARY 20, 2023 – His career was so wide ranging and prolific, it might be difficult to say what he is best known for, but *Star Trek* composer Gerald Fried has died at the age of 95.

According to <u>Variety</u>, the "prolific Fried scored approximately 40 films, some three dozen TV-movies and miniseries, and episodes of another 40 TV series during a ca-

reer that spanned more than six decades."

Star Trek fans will recognize Fried's music in the fan-favorite season two episode of Star Trek: The Original Series, "Amok Time," including "The Ritual/Ancient Battle/2nd Kroykah," which is heard during the koon-ut-kal-if-fee fight scene between Kirk and Spock. He scored other episodes, including "Shore Leave," "Cat's Paw," "Friday's Child," and "The Paradise Syndrome." Fried explained his approach to his Star Trek music in an interview with the Television Acade-

NASA to Discuss Findings from Successful Artemis I Moon Mission



NASA will hold a media teleconference at 12 p.m. EST Tuesday, March 7, to provide an update on data analyzed thus far on the agency's <u>Artemis I</u> Moon mission, the first integrated flight test of the agency's Space Launch System (SLS) rocket, uncrewed Orion spacecraft, and associated ground systems.



NASA's Orion spacecraft splashed down in the Pacific Ocean, Dec. 11, completing the Artemis I flight test after traveling nearly 270,000 miles from our home planet at its farthest distance – more than 1,000 times farther than where the International Space Station orbits Earth – to intentionally stress systems before flying crew. The mission began with a successful liftoff of NASA's SLS rocket Nov. 16, from Launch Pad 39B at NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida.

Artemis I was the first of a series of challenging missions to build a long-term lunar presence for scientific discovery and a steppingstone on the way to Mars. NASA's <u>Artemis II</u> flight test will carry astronauts aboard Orion around the Moon, and will pave the way for the first human mission to the lunar South Pole on <u>Artemis III</u>.

DART's epic asteroid crash: What NASA has learned 5 months later

We now know that we can knock an asteroid off course.



NASA's Double Asteroid Redirection Test (DART) mission had two main goals: to show that an asteroid could be targeted in a high-speed encounter, and to demonstrate that the target's orbit could be changed — a technique astronomers hope to use for planetary defense should a dangerous space rock come our way.
