Rules and Instructions:

1. The photo's subject must be a current STARFLEET member in any recognized Starfleet uniform from any of the movies or television series. The member must be alone in the photo—no group shots. Cropped photos are acceptable. We need to see as much of the uniform as possible.
2. The photo must be current within the last 12 months.
4. Submit the photo no later than midnight UTC on May 31, 2023. Send it as an email ATTACHMENT to the CQ Photo Contest Coordinator, FCAPT John Hardy, co.ussex@gmail.com.
5. The email to FCAPT Hardy MUST include the member's name, rank, chapter, region, SCC#, where the photo was taken, and when the photo was taken (month and year are sufficient).
6. A second ATTACHMENT to the submission email is the required STARFLEET Photo Release Form, signed and dated. There are two forms, one for those over 18, and one for those under 18 that must be signed by a parent or guardian. Those forms are in the Resources tab under the Member Hub on the STARFLEET website.
7. Photos may not be submitted except by the member shown in the photo (except if a minor, then by the guardian).



Cooking with Neelix



Stuffed Cinnamon Crescent Rolls

- **For the cinnamon rolls:**
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- flour, as needed, for dusting a work surface
- 1 can refrigerated crescent dinner rolls
- 8 large marshmallows
- **For the glaze topping:**
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 teaspoons milk



Position a rack to the center of the oven.

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.

Spray a medium-size muffin tin with cooking spray.

In a small bowl, combine the granulated sugar and the cinnamon.

Add the melted butter to another small bowl.

Lightly dust the work surface with the flour.

On the floured surface, separate the crescent rolls into 8 triangles.

Dip the marshmallows into the butter and then into the sugar mixture, ensuring all sides are coated.

Place 1 of the coated marshmallows onto each of the dough triangles, roll them up and pinch the seams to tightly seal, ensuring the marshmallow is covered.

Roll each of the marshmallow rolls into the butter and then into the cinnamon sugar and place them into the prepared muffin cups.

Bake the rolls until they are golden, about 12-14 minutes.

Allow the rolls to cool in the muffin tin for 2 minutes.

Use a butter knife or offset spatula to transfer the rolls onto a cooling rack covered with wax paper and let them cool slightly.

In a medium bowl, combine the powdered sugar, the vanilla, and the milk and beat until the sugar has dissolved.

Transfer the rolls to a serving platter and drizzle them with the glaze.

Sprinkle the rolls with the pecans.

Serve warm.

Star Trek: Strange New Worlds season two wrapped production last July, and Paramount+ has yet to set a release date. However, it looks like that news is coming soon, along with official confirmation about another season. The official date for season two is... soon!

Jonathan Frakes Reflects on the Conclusion of Star Trek: Discovery

When it comes to *Star Trek* directors, one name has risen over the years to near if not at the top of the list for all sorts of reasons: Jonathan Frakes. He has directed 38 television episodes across the franchise as well as two films. He is now putting his mark on the concluding season of *Star Trek: Discovery*.

In an interview with *IGN*, Frakes talked about finishing up the series and making adjustments to the story now that it's known season five will be the final season of *Disco*. Additional filming is to take place due to the announcement, and, says the veteran director, "I'm told they have a very satisfying fix so that it will conclude in a way that will tie the story up. And I think they've figured out how to do it. So they're going to go back and shoot and add to this finale that [producing director] Olatunde [Osunsanmi] and I did."

Frakes has seven previous directing credits just on *Discovery*, and he reflected on how the series opened doors to new *Trek* series and the representation embodied in Anthony Rapp and Wilson Cruz and their characters, among other delights of working on the set. "There's so much about that show that was so *Star Trek* and so important," he said.

NASA, SpaceX Dragon Delivers Heart Studies, More to Space Station



Creating a golden streak in the night sky, a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket soars upward after liftoff from Launch Complex 39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida on March 14, 2023, on the company's 27th Commercial Resupply Services mission for the agency to the International Space Station. Liftoff was at 8:30 p.m. EDT. The Dragon spacecraft will deliver more than 6,000 pounds of science and research, supplies, and equipment to the crew aboard the space station, including the final two experiments comprising the National Institutes for Health and International Space Station National Laboratory's Tissue Chips in Space initiative, Cardinal Heart 2.0 and Engineered Heart Tissues-2. The spacecraft is expected to spend about a month attached to the orbiting outpost before it returns to Earth with research and return cargo, splashing down off the coast of Florida.

NASA Prepares for Historic Asteroid Sample Delivery on Sept. 24

NASA's [OSIRIS-REx](#) spacecraft is cruising back to Earth with a sample it collected from the rocky surface of asteroid Bennu. When its sample capsule parachutes down into the Utah desert on Sept. 24, OSIRIS-REx will become the United States' first-ever mission to return an asteroid sample to Earth.

After seven years in space, including a [nail-biting touchdown on Bennu to gather dust and rocks](#), this intrepid mission is about to face one of its biggest challenges yet: deliver the asteroid sample to Earth while protecting it from heat, vibrations, and earthly contaminants.

“Once the sample capsule touches down, our team will be racing against the clock to recover it and get it to the safety of a temporary clean room,” said Mike Moreau, deputy project manager at [NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center](#) in Greenbelt, Maryland.

So, over the next six months, the OSIRIS-REx team will practice and refine the procedures required to recover the sample in Utah and transport it to a new lab built for the material at NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston. There, scientists will unpack the sample, distribute up to a quarter of it to the OSIRIS-REx science team around the world for analysis, and curate the rest for other scientists to study, now and in future generations. t [NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center](#) in Greenbelt, Maryland .
