Chief Medical Officer Report

Here's a Thought: All my life I thought I was free until I bought a bag of chips.

Hibernation. Will This Be The Way We Travel in Space?

We want to get to Mars and beyond. We all know time and weight are major problems. To get four astronauts to Mars and back, they would need 11 tons of food. This is nearly 10 times the weight of the Perseverance rover. Now, add in all the other essentials and it would come at least 330 tons – two fully grown blue whales. Doesn't look so good.

So, hibernation, of course, is being very seriously investigated. There is an arctic ground squirrel that often hibernates up to eight months: Body temperature 37 degrees, heart beat maybe once a minute. And yet when spring arrives it warms up to 98.6 degrees in a couple of hours.

We've seen hibernations, of course. Bats, bears, birds, reptiles, bugs, but the squirrel is extreme. Somehow the movies and books "neglect" to say anything about how to power down a human close to death, and then revive on demand with no damage. Cooling gel just doesn't quite cut it! I know, I know, it's entertainment.

Some early research showed promise. Hypothermia (therapeutic) is used on cardiac patients to decrease their metabolism while they heal. Their body temp was lowered to 89 degrees, and they were kept there only for a few days, because cold caused intense shivering which then needed sedatives, neuromuscular blockers, which then caused breathing stoppage. Now astronauts would have to be intubated and have many, many needles for required IV fluids.

Thus, in 1992, when Dr. Drew was studying neurochemistry of coho salmon, the arctic squirrel "popped" up and curious anomalies were discovered. This science team discovery as they very carefully took tiny samples under the skin of the skull for brain

chemicals there were no scars or anything to show the insertion points. This seemed to indicate that the hibernating state was protective? Studies have/are being done on bats and bears (some brave souls actually entered bears' dens and stuck thermometers up bears' rectums in the early years...).

Dr. Drew was able to initially get funding for her studies that would also help wounded soldiers in the field by quickly chilling them. However, it was a rather small obscure Japanese paper on Syrian Hamsters Hibernation (2007) that seemed to open more new investigations. It was rats that got the brunt of the initial drug tests. There were several concoctions consisting 8-(p-sulfopheny), 8-SPT, gamma-amino-butric acid (known as GABA), and quite a few others...the rats which were in hypothermia and then pulled from it with some of the GABA potions fared well. It is NASA's goal to begin testing on humans by 2026. We may be altering some genes to fit better eventually. As of now we also have no idea if hibernation will impair human cognitive functions.

Other good stuff seems to come from hibernation. Slowed cells may develop significant resistance to radiation. Some drugs may increase longevity in space and reduce other side effects of weightlessness by a variety of drugs in combinations. It will be wonderful to see how this goes, as it might be the only we will be able to traverse space.




Creality, Prusa, Bamboo and many more. I ran into a few of my favorite YouTubers and a couple of prop building friends. Even met a guy from

ENERGY BALLS

Originally from my school teacher friend Jo Salvage!

Tasty Ingredients:

4 cups of quick oats

2/3 (or more to taste) mini chocolate chips. The big ones work, but the minis are better. I prefer milk chocolate, but actually dark chocolate and white chocolate work well, too.

½ cup of coconut (optional: toasted, I recommend it!)

% cup of sliced almonds. I recommend sliced, as it blends more readily than slivered.

Mix all dry ingredients in a large bowl and set aside.

More tasty ingredients:

1 ½ cups of creamy peanut butter ½ cup of honey

I recommend that you slightly warm the honey and peanut butter (separately), no more than 10 seconds for the peanut butter and 5 seconds for the honey for it will mix much more easily. Combine the honey and peanut butter. Mix very well.

Add the pb/honey mixture to the dry ingredients. Mix well. You will have to use your hands to incorporate everything. Chill for about 20 minutes.

Form into walnut (or smaller) to golf size balls-your decision! How many you get will, of course, depend upon what size you make. I found that taking about a large teaspoon of mix and squashing into the palm of my hand to make sure it would stick together, and then gently rolling it between my palms seem to work best. Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator.





"Why are humans so central to the Federation?" It seems an odd thing when you think about it. With so many arguably more advanced cultures and physiologically better suited species in the UFP, why are humans so highly regarded?

After years of thinking about this point, I think I may have recently stumbled on the answer in one of my other favorite IPs, The Lord of the Rings. Yes, that is an unlikely place to find answers to questions about Star Trek. However, both properties embrace truly universal ideas. That makes them both relatable and that is what has made them pillars in the world of fiction and popular culture on the whole.

In the Lord of the Rings films, Boromir is confronted with the idea that there was still hope for Gondor. Upon telling this to Aragorn, he adds, "But I cannot see it... It is long since we had any hope." In the books, this notion is expressed, among other places, in this line from Aragorn in The Fellowship of the Ring, "We must do without hope..."

It is one of humanity's better traits to be able to keep going in the face of insurmountable odds. This, along with a defiant streak a mile wide, combines to make humans

unique beings in most fiction. This is also the key trait that determines the outcome of so many situations in both the fictional world and in reality.

Countless times in history we have had to overcome scenarios that seemed unwinnable. It happens so much that Starfleet created the "Kobayashi Maru" to test the character of potential officers. Cadets, with the exception of a certain young man from Iowa, would go in with zero hope of winning. Yet, they had to act as though they could. The existence of the Federation hung on this aspect of the human nature more times than one could easily count. And in every case we see, this spirit carries our protagonists through.

In Star Trek VI, Spock, when confronted by a young Vulcan who believes logic to be the chiefest of virtues, educates her on the merits of faith; "...faith that the universe will unfold as it should." This is the closest that Vulcan philosophy gets to hope against hope. And it wasn't until after Spock comes to terms with his human nature in The Motion Picture and rediscovers himself in The Voyage Home that he is able to fully understand this point.

Each culture that comes into the UFP imprints itself on the entirety. This is especially true of the ones that were part of its founding. The Federation's continued longevity has nearly always been dependent on its ability to overcome in the face of hopelessness. This is humanity's biggest contribution to the dream. May it be one that we all embody, should the need arise.

Goddard, Wallops Engineers Test Printed Electronics in Space

"Today's small spacecraft pack sensors, guidance and control, 04-02270 and operating electronics into Directory

every available space. Printing electronic circuits on the walls



and structures of spacecraft could help future missions do more in smaller packages.

Engineers successfully tested hybrid printed circuits at the edge of space in an April 25 sounding rocket flight from NASA's Wallops Flight Facility near Chincoteague, Virginia. Electronic temperature and humidity sensors printed onto the payload bay door and onto two attached panels monitored the entire SubTEC-9 sounding rocket mission, recording data that was beamed to the ground.

The experiment by aerospace engineer Beth Paquette and electronics engineer Margaret Samuels of NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Maryland, sought to prove the space-readiness of printed electronics technology. rom NASA.gov
