Chief Medical Officer Report

MAN'S BEST FRIEND

Jellybean, a Labrador retriever owned by Patricia and Zach Mendonca, was diagnosed with osteosarcoma cancer nearly 3 years ago. She had an amputation and chemotherapy. Sadly, however, the cancer spread through her blood to her lungs. Generally, at this point, these dogs have only about two months to live. In November 2020 the Mendonca's were able to enroll Jellybean in a clinical trial at Tufts University in Rhode Island. The dog was given a trio of pills daily until February 2021. The results were quite surprising and good. Hope in the cancer battle.

Osteosarcoma affects humans also, particularly children and teenagers. Fortunately, it is uncommon, but there has been no better or new treatments for 35 years.

Dog studies are helping! Dog and human cancers such as osteosarcoma are extremely similar. Under a microscope they are virtually indistinguishable. Thus, many studies for dogs can be related back to humans. Testing in dogs is closely monitored, but it is not quite as stringent as it would be in children and teenagers, so testing may go a bit more quickly.

Dogs are more suitable for these studies than mice, because dogs live in environments that people live in and can be studied as tumors grow/occur more "naturally." Dogs also respond to treatments much like humans do. In 2019 28 dogs received a commercially available cancer drug, and a common blood

pressure pill which helped stop cancer growth. This pair of drugs initially helped to shrink 50% of the tumors. Now the dogs are receiving a third test drug to improve the cancer reduction. It is not commercially available yet. And yes, Jellybean is alive and doing well.

Human tests are now in progress using the two drugs plus a human version of the canine drug.

Another dog trial is in progress at Colorado State University using Listeria Monocytogenes. This particularly nasty bacterium is well known for food poisoning, but when weakened it stimulates the immune system. Early studies in dogs with this "vaccine" cause the immune system to patrol the body and kill cancer cells. Human studies are now in progress.

Canine trials, overseen by the National Cancer Institute are helping scientists understand cancer in general. Blood tests, DNA analysis, pet cancer data, realizing and observing cancercausing mutations and how these various drugs work in dogs is translating quite readily for human use. Studies are showing more and more that dogs and humans have very similar genetic mutations and that similar treatments are giving similar outcomes.

It's appearing that many canine drugs will be repurposed for human use.

A traditional pipeline for a new drug can take 10 years to develop, and billions f dollars. So this should save time and money. Applying machine learning could also speed things up! A very important item which must be kept in mind is that dogs are patients first, not just study subjects. Their care and welfare is a top priority. After all, they are MAN'S BEST FRIEND!



From the Chaplain

Principles

Ethical quandaries are a far more common part of life than we realize or would like. Each day has a new batch of challenges to overcome. The challenges can be major or minor, but with each challenge comes a series of decisions that have to be made. These decisions are typically quite mundane; however, some have moral and ethical factors that cannot be avoided.

Each of us has a moral code. It is shaped by our philosophy, religious views, our upbringing, and our personal experiences. The aspects of these codes are divided into parts: ideals, and principles. Ideals are standards of perfection. They are targets to aim at. These targets may or may not be hit. Falling short of these marks can be disheartening. However, we are typically able to rally our human tenacity to keep going and work toward doing better. That may take the form of making reconciliation with our religious views, apologizing and trying to make things right, licking our wounds and striving to do better next time, or any combination of these.

Principles, on the other hand, those are much more fundamental in nature. Principles are the beliefs that serve as the building blocks of our moral foundation. To go contrary to these can have much longer lasting consequences than merely falling short of a mark. While we can unintentionally fail to live up to our ideals, to undermine our principles requires a decision to do so. These types of deviations from our normal conduct can, over time, lead us down the road to rewriting our own moral and ethical codes.

In *Star Trek*, there are many instances where the characters are called upon to make such decisions. Every time that happens, the story shifts to focus on the decision to be made and the amount of

deliberation, external and internal, the ones making it go through. Simply put, these decisions are such a big deal that they trump the action happening.

When one particular principle is ignored, it is like a hammer stroke on stone. It doesn't collapse immediately, but chips away slowly. However, it will eventually become less foundational and more flexible. At length, it can no longer be called a principle at all. Principles also tend to be linked, one to another. Once one block is removed, the others must shift accordingly.

Additionally, it is our level of adherence to these principles that shapes us into who we are. It determines the heights to which we are willing to aspire and strive for. It also shows the depths to which we can sink. For this reason, one needs to deliberate every moral and ethical decision very carefully. When we allow the deterioration of the stones in our foundation, we can unwittingly cause a cascade effect in our character or the character of any entity (organization, business, etc.) that we are a part of. Each violation of principle is a slippery slope and one that we must tread with great caution. It should never be treated as a small thing.

Let us go forward being mindful of what each action says about us and those we affiliate ourselves with. Weighing the consequences of our actions against posterity. And understanding that each decision sets a precedent by which other decisions will be measured. We will not always be perfect, but we should tread lightly where we are asked to violate our principles.
