September Away Mission Greek Adventure

Bob and I went to visit his cousins in Greece again. This time we flew on United Airlines in first class from Newark to Athens. Less costly than Delta first class but both were very similar. It's a 2-and-a-half-hour drive from Athens to the towns at the base of his cousin's mountain. We stopped for lunch at Sympoliteia at Café Maritimo



on a beach of the Gulf of Corinth. The beach was all smooth river rocks instead of sand. I had zucchini blossoms stuffed with meat and rice. Delicious!





The drive up the mountain to the village of Arravonitsa was 15 minutes on a narrow road without guardrails on the side of the mountain with hairpin turns. If we had to pass another vehicle there were mere inches between

us. They need to go to the towns at the base of the mountain for almost everything. There are no shops in the village. They do have a bakery truck that comes to the village daily and a huckster wagon with fruit and vegetables that visit twice a week. The weather was warm with a breeze. We stayed with Eleni and her husband, Dimitri. They have the Fotopoulos family home. The part we stayed in was a two-bedroom house added in 1967 onto the over 300-year-old, 2

room stone house. The stone walls are probably 1 meter thick so it's very comfortable in there. Dimitri likes to sleep there. Bob and Eleni's grandfathers were brothers. Their grandfathers were part of a family of 9 who all lived in that old 2 room stone house. Some other cousins, from Minneapolis, were also visiting in the village.







The daily routine is very slow and quiet. The bakery truck comes at 8:30. They buy Bougatza, a custard filled phyllo pastry, cheese pizza and a loaf of bread. So breakfast is about 9. After breakfast activities varied. Sometimes we showered, or played our dice game, or they napped. Our main meal was usually about 3pm. They always took a nap



afterwards. In the evening we didn't have a meal but would have a dessert around 8pm. Once we met their Minneapolis cousins in Selianitika for a late dinner. Several times we ate a late dinner in one of the towns nearby.

GOFT PUMPKIN COOKIES

DRY INGREDIENTS

- 2 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon salt

WET INGREDIENTS

- 1 ½ cups granulated sugar
- ½ cup butter, softened
- 1 cup pure pumpkin
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup powdered sugar

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.
- Line baking sheets with parchment paper or spray with non-stick baking spray.
- DRY INGREDIENTS: Cobine flour, baking soda, baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt in a medium bowl. Stir with a spoon to mix the ingredients.
- 4. WET INGREDIENTS: Beat sugar and butter with a mixer on medium high speed, then blend in pumpkin, egg, and vanilla.
- 5. Gradually mix in dry ingredients and continue to beat until the batter is smooth and creamy.
- 6. Scoop one inch balls of dough and place them on the prepared baking sheet.
- 7. Sprinkle the dough balls with powdered sugar.
- 8. Bake for 11-13 minutes.
 - When completely cool, store cookies in an airtight container.





However, in most works of fiction, it is our curiosity that puts us in the most danger. Even movies in the genres mentioned have taken to embracing this point. But in real life, the dangers are no less real. This desire to do what has not been done before, to go where others have not, to explain the unexplained, and to push boundaries has exacted a toll. Explorers have gone missing, and disasters have claimed lives. But still our curiosity drives us onward.

Objectively, we could almost consider this madness. However, this curiosity is part of what makes us human, and it has brought about discoveries that have continued to shape the world. Without the spirit of exploration, it would seem unlikely that most of us would be here. As citizens of the United States, we owe our very existence to exploration. Without asking why and searching for the answers, many medicines and treatments wouldn't exist. And innovation after innovation stems back to pushing boundaries. Instead of being frightened away by the high toll that such curiosity extracts, we move forward in honor of those that have gone before.

It is by continuing in this spirit of curiosity that we write our human story. May it ever drive us to "Boldly go where no one has gone before."
