Chief Medical Officer Report

WEIGHT LOSS AND FAT REDUCTION

Weight loss is undergoing some serious medical review. A recent drug, tirzepatide, better known as the diabetic drug Ozempic and Wegovy has been discovered to help with big time weight loss, or as it's used by doctors for the obesity epidemic.

Weight loss history is replete with wild speculation (boom to bust, sadly) and small scientific progress. Bariatric Surgery was used mostly in the late 50's to 60's. People lost up to 70% of the extra weight. However, side effects were terrible: food left the stomach too quickly, causing dizziness, excessive sweating, rapid heart rate, and vomiting. How is it that no appetite can be a good thing? There is the mantra that we have the right to choose what to do with our bodies, but there is not enough information on these medicines to be able to choose long term. The diabetic use of these medicines is being monitored extremely closely. In essence, these drugs are being used as ongoing tests on the participants as never been done before.

Sadly, it appears that everyone will have to work harder to combat an antifat bias that actually started over 50 years ago. What has happened is that the bariatric surgery, "diabetic drugs," crash diets, or the plethora of other "noon-medical" diets are not miracles or cures. There will always be some

fat people (human nature) no matter what they are — "non-responders, refuse-niks, or languishers."

Weight loss discussions must be the reflexive scientism of single-minded scrutiny to a broader perspective.

Weight isn't exactly a biological "problem" but an accumulation of societal problems of power, ranking, race, status, etc., to the most human of conditions of wanting more.



CURRY LENTIL SOUP WITH CHARRED CAULIFLOWER

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 3 carrots, chopped
- 1 large yellow onion, chopped
- 1 teaspoon fine sea salt (leave out if broth is not low-sodium)
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/8 to ¼ teaspoon red pepper flakes (optional, if you like spice)
- 4 cups low-sodium vegetable broth
- 1 cup unsweetened full-fat coconut milk
- 1 cup green lentils, sorted and rinsed
- 2 tablespoons curry powder
- 3-inch strip kombu (seaweed, page 16), optional
- 3 cups loosely packed, roughly chopped kale, stems removed
- 1 tablespoon fresh lime juice
- 1 recipe Charred Cauliflower

DIRECTIONS:

Heat the oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the carrots, onion, and salt and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened but now brown, about 5 minutes. Add the garlic and pepper flakes (if using) and cook, stirring

continuously, for 1 minutes, being careful not to let the garlic brown.

Add the broth, coconut milk, lentils, curry powder, and kombu. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat and simmer covered, stirring occasionally, until the lentils are soft, 25 minutes.

Remove the kombu and discard. Stir in the kale and simmer for 5 minutes. Turn off the heat and stir in the lime juice. Taste and season with additional salt and pepper flakes if needed. If too thick, add ½ cup water or more until the desired consistence is reached. Serve topped with Charred Cauliflower.

CHARRED CAULIFLOWER

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 large head cauliflower, cut into similar-size florets (to ensure even cook time)
- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- ½ teaspoon fine sea salt

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F.

Place the cauliflower florets on a large baking sheet and dry well with a paper towel. Add the oil, cumin, and salt and toss well to combine.

Spread out on the baking sheet and roast in the center of the oven until well browned and slightly charred, 25 to 30 minutes.

Easy Slow Cooker Mexican Casserole

PREP TIME20 minutes
COOK TIME4 hours
TOTAL TIME4 hours 20 minutes
Ingredients

- 3 pounds ground beef
- 1 diced white onion
- 1 diced green pepper
- 1 teaspoon of black pepper (optional)
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 3-10 ounce cans of Rotel tomatoes and green chilies, drained
- 15.25 ounce can of whole kernel corn, drained
- 15.25 ounce can of black beans, drained
- 19 ounce can of red enchilada sauce
- 3-1 ounce package of taco seasoning
- 2 pounds shredded Mexican cheese
- 5.25 ounce package of Spanish rice
- 10 flour tortillas or corn tortillas and or corn chips

Instructions

Cook the ground beef, onions, and green pepper in a large saucepan. Drain the grease.

Add the ground beef back into the saucepan add taco seasoning, pepper and chili powder and mix well.

Grease a slow cooker

Mix the ground beef, Rotel tomatoes, corn, black beans and red enchilada sauce and mix well

Cover with the lid and cook on low for three hours.

Prepare the Spanish rice according to its directions and mix in with rest of the items. Mix in 1 pound of the shredded cheese and cook for 1 hour

Top the casserole with the remaining cheese and cook until melted

Garlic Soup

INGREDIENTS:

2 tablespoons of butter

6-8 LARGE cloves of garlic, chopped

1 large onion, chopped

2 egg yolks

2 tablespoons of flour

6 cups of chicken or vegetable stock

1 cup of ½ and ½ milk

1 teaspoon of salt

PREPARATION:

Melt butter in a heavy pot and saute onions and garlic until they are golden. Add the flour and stir until well blended with the soft vegetables. Stir in the broth and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer 5 minutes. Remove from heat and take 1 cup at a time of the hot mixture and put in a blender and blend it to a smooth consistency. Return to the pot. Whisk the egg yolks and ½ and ½ together in a big bowl. Slowly add a cup of the hot mixture to this egg mixture while stirring vigorously. Do several cups this way. Then, slowly add the cream mixture back into the remaining hot mixture slowly and stirring constantly. Return to low heat for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Serve with a dash of black pepper and/or thyme on top of the servings!

From the Chaplain

Aurë entuluva!

As this year comes to a close, I find myself in my usual contemplative state of mind. Given the generally festive nature around the holidays, it is no small wonder that some of my friends have mistaken such a severe attitude for depression. In attempts to be less of a downer, my compromise has been to meditate on more positive matters. This year, the idea that has been absorbing my quiet times has been the nature of hope.

Hope, as a concept, is one that is significant to pretty much everyone. As a natural pessimist, it is something that I often lack. My personal religion promotes it as a good thing. *Star Trek--* in fact, nearly all of my major interests have hope as a central theme.

In the Bible, Hebrews 6:19 says, "We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain,"

In the Kelvin Timeline (*Star Trek Beyond*), Spock is quoted as saying, "We will do what we have always done, Jim. We will find hope in the impossible."

In the Green Lantern franchise, the Blue Lantern Corps has the oath, "In fearful day, in raging night, with strong hearts full, our souls ignite. When all seems lost in this war of light, look to the stars, for hope burns bright!"

But for the sake of this article, I'm going to take a cannonball dive into the deep end of Middle-earth.

You see, Professor Tolkien, in the writing of his greater legendarium, really explored the idea of hope in a manner that few others have. He looks at hope as something both ethereal and concrete, a con-

stant and a variable. He sees it as something that can be bestowed upon another, even if the granting party has little-to-none themselves.

Looking to *The Silmarillion*, we see Tolkien's writing at its darkest. There are things in that book that would shock the more casual fans. But, when the stories are at their darkest, the theme of hope is at its most prominent. One of these stories is "The Last Stand of Húrin at the Nirnaeth Arnoediad."

The Nirnaeth Arnoediad is also known as The Battle of Unnumbered Tears. It was one of the battles against Morgoth (Middle-earth's Satan) and is considered one of the darkest moments in the greater legendarium as, in this case, Morgoth wins. Through the course of the fighting, the united forces of Elves, Men and Dwarves are being trounced on. Húrin, as one of the prominent men, fights to the last. His defeat was epic. As everything was falling apart and he knew defeat was inevitable, he decided that he would just keep going.

Abandoning his shield to pick up a two-handed battle axe, he began to cry aloud, "Aurë entuluva! Day shall come again!" as he hacked away at the orcs that were attacking him. He yelled it out with every strike of the axe. He was cleaving limbs from the orcs so swiftly, that the hands stayed clinging to him after they were severed. He yelled it out seventy times before he was finally captured.

In this instance, Tolkien wrote of what he termed, "Northern Courage." This is a form of reckless abandonment that comes over heroes in many of the Norse and Celtic stories and leads to one person doing a great deed before their inevitable fall. However, in this particular case, the words of Húrin speak of a hope that he knows will endure, even after he falls. This is less of an abandonment than it is a defiant hope. This is a proclamation of future victory in the face of momentary defeat.

If we then turn to *The Lord of the Rings*, we see the theme of hope similarly spattered all throughout, if not quite as heavy handed. But

where Lord of the Rings differs is how it handles the idea of hope. As in *The Silmarillion* and most other literature, the traditional understanding of the concept is maintained. However, two more unique notions are brought forward in the pages of this work. Firstly, that hope is a trait that is not necessary to work toward a goal. And secondly, that you do not need hope to inspire others.

In book four, chapter three of *The Lord of the Rings* (That's in *The Two Towers* for those that break it down into the standard volumes.), we get a glimpse into the mind of Sam that sadly didn't translate into the movies. Sam is typically seen as the hopeful one. He encourages Frodo to keep going and insists on trying to save the rations long enough to make it all the way to, and back from, Mount Doom. Whereas Frodo regularly acknowledges the unlikelihood of their making it back, even if they make it there.

However, in the book we see this line as they are staring down at the Black Gate of Mordor and the impossible task of getting in. "And after all he (Sam) never had any real hope in the affair from the beginning; but being a cheerful hobbit, he had not needed hope, as long as despair could be postponed."

You see, hope in this context is something separate from the sense of duty. Sam is following Frodo out of a sense of friendship and responsibility. This is in some sense a form of hope, as it requires him to think of the needs of a future that very likely will not come, but that isn't the same thing as a sense of expected success. Just as the eleventh chapter in Hebrews points to people who had not received their promises to show that good things can and do happen after we are gone, Sam maintains an idea of a future that he cannot, and may never, see. This becomes a strange ethereal hope that both is and isn't present. It is, however, sufficient to keep them going.

Then, if we dive deeper into *The Lord of the Rings*, we will eventually stumble across the appendices. It is in these (Appendix A to be precise) that we find the story of Gilraen, Aragorn's mother.

After the death of her husband, Arathorn, Gilraen took their two-year-old son, Aragorn, to Rivendell for his safety. As the last heir to the two kingdoms of Arnor and Gondor, Gilraen knew that he was not safe. To further protect him, Aragorn went by an Elven name while he was there; Estel. The selection of this name is not insignificant. In Sindarin, the name "Estel" means "Hope." And even this takes a deeper meaning as Aragorn's birth was foretold to some degree by his maternal grandparents with the expression, "...hope may be born for our people..."

Sadly, Gilraen would not live to see this "Hope" come into fruition. And what was worse, she was very aware that she wouldn't. Her whole time in Rivendell was spent in the fear of what might happen to her son and the events that were to come. She worried so much that what should have been an exceptionally long life (as she was of the dúnedain), was cut down to the length of a normal person. Her last words to her son were, "Ónen i-Estel Edain, ú-chebin estel anim." Which, being roughly translated from the Sindarin, means, "I give hope to men/the dúnedain, I have kept no hope for myself."

This was an obvious allusion to her son's Elvish name. While she would not live to see the hope she preserved go beyond an idea, it inevitably changed the world. Because she looked beyond herself, she sent a great hope forward. I think about this more often than I care to admit. As a pessimist, I seldom expect good things for myself. However, that doesn't mean that I shouldn't act with a mind to the future and what good my efforts can bring about.

If you can see fit to look past the excessive length of this article, I hope that you can take away something encouraging from it. That is that no matter how dark things may seem, no matter how much wrong has taken hold, "...Day shall come again!"

"Axiom Space, which holds a firm-fixed price, indefinite-delivery, indefinite-quantity contract with NASA, is on schedule to launch and attach its first module, named Axiom Hab One, to the International Space Station in 2026. A total of four modules are planned for the Axiom Commercial Segment attached to the station. After the

space station's retirement, the Axiom Commercial Segment will separate and become a free-flying commercial destination named Axiom Station.

The hatches of the Axiom Hab One module are fabricated and prepared to undergo pressure testing to ensure a strong enough seal to withstand the vacuum of space. Manufacturing of the Axiom Hab One module is underway, and the critical design review will occur in 2024. During this review, NASA will assess the maturity of the Axiom Space design and provide feedback necessary to ensure safe operations when it is attached to the International Space Station."
