Oatmeal Crisp Dessert

Ingredients:

**4 cups sliced tart apples (about 4 medium) 2/3 to 3/4 cup packed with brown sugar ½ cup all-purpose flour (or self-rising)



½ cup oats

1/3 cup margarine or butter, softened

3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

³/₄ teaspoon ground nutmeg

**or 2 cans (17 oz ea) of apricots or 1 can (21 oz) Cherry pie filling, or 1 can (29oz) canned peaches, or 2 cans (13.5oz ea) of pineapple

Drain the cans of the juice. If the mixture needs moisture, you can add the juice gradually. Lessen the sugar accordingly.

If you use canned fruit or pie filling, use the lesser amount of brown sugar. (Let's not go crazy on the sugar . . .)

Directions:

Heat oven to 375

Arrange fruit in greased square pan 8x8x2 Mix remaining ingredients, sprinkle over fruit Bake until topping is golden brown and apples are tender—about 30 minutes Serve warm and if desired, add ice cream or vanilla yogurt Cozy Winter White Bean Soup

Ingredients:

2 Tbsp olive oil

1 medium onion, diced (about a cup)

2 stalks of celery, diced

3 (large) garlic cloves, minced

2 cans of white beans, drained

and lightly rinsed

2 medium potatoes, diced (about 2 cups)

2 large carrots, diced

1 tsp finely chopped parsley or ½ tsp dried parsley

1 tsp salt

½ tsp coarse pepper

6 cups of vegetable broth

1 cup of water

Possible salt and pepper to taste.

In a large soup pot, heat olive oil over medium heat. Add onion and celery, cook until they are just starting to turn translucent. Add garlic and cook until veggies are tender.

Add the potatoes, beans, carrots, salt, parsley, 6 cups of broth, 1 cup of water and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for about an hour. If necessary, add more water, and salt and pepper to taste!





From the Chaplain

Star Trek: Voyager is probably my least favorite series in the franchise. That is not to say that it is without its merits, and it is certainly in no way a reflection on those who love it. It is simply a matter of my preferences. However, with that having been said, I am currently doing a watch-through of the entire series. The episode that I recently finished is Season 2, Episode #19: "Lifesigns." Critics of Voyager often cite that there is very little character development, but this episode seems to go contrary to that stance in that the Doctor seems to make a huge leap forward.

The EMH turned CMO of the ship learned to love. This is no small feat considering his entire being is an elaborate computer program and his physical manifestation is nothing more than photons and forcefields. However, despite the obvious roadblocks to such developments, the adaptive nature of his programming managed to allow love to "conquer all," as the saying goes. This is a very meaningful development, not only for the character, whose newfound love allows him to start viewing patients as a whole person as opposed to machines to be fixed; but also, for me as a viewer.

I, as well as many others in the world, have some issues with connecting to others. It isn't just that we (myself and others with similar issues) aren't good with people, as many of us have developed adequate social skills, but that people can come and go in our lives without us really feeling it. A lot of the time, I find myself questioning just how real a given connection is for me or feeling like a fake friend. The fact that I'd give the shirt off my

back to help someone seems irrelevant to me compared to the fact that if that person leaves, I feel nothing. It's an odd sensation indeed to not mourn the loss of people in a way that the people around you deem appropriate. It makes one question the validity of the relationship, at least as far as their own part in it. It makes you ask, "Can I love?"

Watching this episode and seeing a program develop to the point of being able to reciprocate affection was, in a way, cathartic. I'm a happily married man. My wife, by the grace of God, has found a way to live with me these sixteen years. And, much like the Vidiian woman that came into the doctor's life, my wife had no intentions of ending up in that situation. In the case of the Vidiian, she was just a patient who was being tended to. The doctor wanted nothing more than to perform the duties he was programmed to do. Yet, somehow, something clicked. General concern and compassion (such as could be felt by a hologram) gave way to a real connection. A connection strong enough to let her go, even when she wanted to stay. A love strong enough to do what was best for the other person at the expense of oneself. In my case, I was content being just a friend until we became something more. Something broke through and allowed a deeper connection. It's part of why my wedding ring reads, "Amor Vinait Omni." Which, being translated from the 13th century (bad) Latin is, "Love Conquers All."

Seeing such a deep connection develop in the life of a projection that was never able or intended to feel love shows a possibility for all who struggle with connection. Not just romantically, but in the case of deep and meaningful friendships. In the form of true compassion and concern for our fellow travelers on this road. It is my sincere hope that we can all find ways for our programming to adapt and become better people.
