Chief Medical Officer Report

Intermittent Fasting!

I think everyone has heard of fasting. It has been mostly associated with religion. However, it has gone way past the religious aspect into serious scientific study. A Japanese cell biologist tracked how cells recycled and renewed themselves during fasting. He won the Nobel Prize for his discoveries

When fasting the body uses fat stores. The change signals the body to go to autophagy, which removes damaged bits of cells and then pushes cell renewal and repair.

Regimens:

- 1. Time Restricted Feeding: Limit daily feedings to a specific time window, 8-10 hours then fast 14-16 hours. This can be daily or limited to a couple days weekly.
- 2. Alternate Day Fasting: Eat normal one day, then severely curtail calories the next.
- 3. 5:2 Normal Diet for 5 days and then restricting calories to 500 to 600 calories on 2 non-consecutive days.
- 4. Warrior Diet: Fast 20 hours, with a 4-hour eating window, normally in the evening.

All these diets are similar in the benefits. It is a must to speak with a healthcare professional before starting a regimen! Most people find #1 the easiest to start when eating stops at 9 PM. Breakfast is coffee or tea without sugar or cream. Hmm - the chief medical officer wonders whatever happened to the old adage that breakfast is your most important me meal of the day? Fasting for a minimum of 12 hours is good, but 15 hours is better! Finding a pattern to suit your lifestyle and maintaining it consistently is paramount.

BENFITS OF INTERMITTENT FASTING:

The benefits that have come to light through intermittent fasting are enhanced cognitive performance, weight loss, reduced cardiovascular risk factors and better blood sugar control. A recent study published in Cell Metabolism suggest it may improve circadian rhythm disruptions, which are believed to add to the progression of Alzheimer's disease. As mentioned, intermittent fasting improves memory and reduces the fibrous amyloid proteins in the brain. Several other studies indicate the intermittent fasting enhances memory, attention, brain processing, speed and cognitive function. Intermittent fasting has shown modest weight loss, (5-15 pounds) as well as waist reduction, reducing body mass index, and cardiometric risk factors.

Another 130 randomized clinical trials also showed improvements in insulin sensitivity, weight, cholesterol pro-

files, fasting blood sugar levels and blood pressure control. It appears intermittent fasting will help prevent heart disease. The Journal of Restorative Medicine highlighted the potential benefits that intermittent fasting may have in preventing and possibly treating cancer, though much research is needed. This could also mean intermittent fasting can help recycle cells, help DNA repair cell tissues, help regeneration, and help protect against the toxicity of chemo.

SAFETY AND OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

Young children, pregnant and breastfeeding mothers, epileptic people, those with eating disorders (or a history of it) or those taking medications that lower blood sugar levels need to exercise caution or avoid fasting at all.

Intermittent fasting can offer many good benefits. However, some people experience severe hunger, cravings, and poor sleep. There are problems with hypoglycemic people and adverse effects on hormonal balance in menstruating women.


Book Review

Lily's Promise

This is a book written by a Holocaust survivor and her great-grandson about her life experiences, most notably the Holocaust. It is a fascinating read about Lily, a Hungarian Jew who was sent to Auschwitz with her family, most of whom did not survive. She made herself a promise that if she survived, she would tell her story. It took her a long time, as the memories were difficult to face. The assistance of her great-grandson was in-



valuable. Lily just turned 100 years old in December of 2023, and is still telling her story.

Her message is one of the need for tolerance in order to prevent such genocides. Her book reminded me of similar Star Trek themes, like the Original Series episode "Let That Be Your Last Battlefield." In that episode two aliens were fighting and were half black and half white on the two sides of their bodies, but had opposite markings. To the outside observer this difference was inconsequential, but to the two aliens it was a battle to the death.

The book is an international best seller and is available from the Toledo-Lucas County Public Library.



Memoirs of a Rocket Scientist
by Chester L. Richards

The book starts out with a trek tale. Judy Burns loved Leonard Nimoy and Star Trek and she figured the best way to meet Mr. Nimoy was to write a script for Star Trek. First she enlisted one of her friends to help write a "ghost story" script for Star Trek. They submitted the script but never heard anything, then after two seasons Star Trek was cancelled. Thanks to a letter writing campaign Trek was renewed for a third season so she enlisted her friend, Chet Richards to help her rewrite the script and submit it.



Their original story had the Enterprise phasing in and out between different universes. A Transporter accident had Mr. Spock beam aboard the parallel Enterprise. When the crew didn't see him aboard their Enterprise they assumed he was dead, had his funeral and everything. Then various crew members would see him in corridors and various places aboard the ship, phasing in and out.

During this time Judy was taking a script writing course with Chet auditing. The class was taught by Bob Duncan who asked "whatever became of that Star Trek script". Judy replied, "Well, we never heard back, with the renewed third season a guy named Fred Freiberger took over." Bob replied, "I've

known Freddy for years, let me talk to him." Shortly after they heard from Fred and got the go ahead with the script. After several rewrites and having Kirk be the one that is lost instead of Spock the episode The Tholian Web was filmed and aired.

The rest of the book, while interesting was about his rafting trips, experiences as an aerospace engineer and his wife. All interesting stuff but not nearly as fascinating as his story of how they wrote for Star Trek.



From the Chaplain

Spirit of Adventure

Recently, I've been making it a point to read more. I tend to get a bit touchy if I don't take time to unwind with a good story or bit of non-fiction. As a result, I've been working through an anthology of classic science fiction. Old sci-fi is a wonderful thing. It has, for the most part, a fairly optimistic view of what humanity is capable of. Jules Verne, in particular, has an interesting view of human nature. Many of his stories are less about human innovation so much as they are adventures centered around exploration and discovery.

Most of his stories are driven forward in the face of whatever practical considerations by men of an adventurous spirit that borders on insanity. However, this is the same spirit that usually ends up being awakened in the other members of the party who, previously, were either reluctant to start or continue the journey. Note though, that the spirit is not being injected into the others. Rather, it is being stirred; much like the coals of a nearly burned-out fire. By nearly all practical inspection, the embers have died. They have been left smothered by the pragmatic views of "rational" men. But, with the right amount of stirring, a little bit of tow or tinder, and a bit of fanning, it can be kindled into a flame once again.

Pragmatism, though very useful on most occasions, can be overdone. When it is overdone, it can strip the meaning out of life. It will make people question the practical applications of every endeavor. It asks, "What practical use is exploring the ocean floor?" or "Why are we wasting money sending rovers to other planets when there are uses for that money here?" It can find itself at odds with the human tendency to ask and wonder about anything

but the necessities. When overdone, it becomes the road to Fahrenheit 451 rather than the Journey to the Center of the Earth.

How boring would existence be if that were the only mindset that we were endowed with?

Fortunately, we live in a world filled with artists and thinkers, innovators and explorers. Gene Roddenberry was inspired by *Horatio Hornblower*. That led to *Star Trek*. *Star Trek* has, in turn, inspired generations of space enthusiasts and scientists. Technology has progressed in leaps and bounds, and it is now starting to look like the words of Jules Verne may be coming true, "Anything you can imagine, you can make real."

When there is a barrier or a boundary that inhibits our desire to know and to discover, we fight against that which would hedge us in. Invention and innovation are thus driven by this spirit that we, as a people, share. In 1903, two brothers made history though others around them scoffed at the idea of powered flight. In 1969, less then a full sixty-six years later, a human stepped on the moon. This is our spirit of adventure in action.

It is a sad truth that so much of what we hand to our younger generations is simple, practical, dull, facts. We hand them bare formulae in the place of inspiration, asking them for quotes more than creativity. It is to our great fortune that the spirit of adventure never dies in our species. No matter what hindrances it may have heaped upon it, it is always smoldering somewhere in our deepest selves just waiting to be awakened. This is a comforting thought because there is so much more to discover; so many mysteries to solve.

In the words of JRR Tolkien,

"...For there are so many things that I have never seen, in every wood, in every spring, there is a different green..."


