Due Renewal Policy

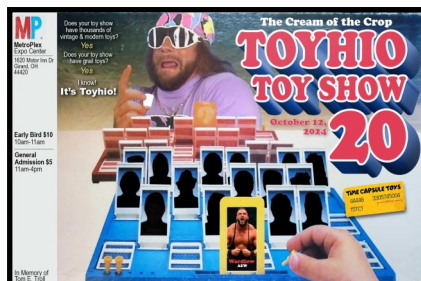

Star Trek Original Series Set Tour Ticonderoga, NY

On July 20, 2024, Dan, our friend Robert, and myself took a weekend trip up to Ticonderoga, NY to visit The Star Trek Original Series Set Tour. This attraction's owner James Cawley was born in 1967 and has been a Trekkie since childhood. At age 17 he contacted Star Trek, costume designer William Ware Theiss for help making an accurate Captain Kirk costume. Their subsequent friendship led to Theiss hiring James to work as an intern in the costume department of Star Trek: The Next Generation. Theiss and James both left TNG after the first season and James went on to have a thriving career as an Elvis impersonator. When Theiss passed away in 1992, he willed copies of the original Enterprise set blueprints to James. With money he saved from his career as an Elvis impersonator, he set out to recreate those sets.



Along with another group of Star Trek fans, they built some of those sets in an old car dealership in Port Henry, NY. They began making fan films which became the web series Star Trek: New Voyages. After 11 episodes were released, Paramount tightened the rules for fan films, and James and his crew could no longer film. Paramount then gave him permission to turn his sets into a museum. The sets were moved into an old dollar store building in James' home town of Ticonderoga, NY, and in July 2016 The Original Series Set Tour was born.



Upon entering the attraction, you are in the gift shop. Along the walls in glass display cases are many actual screen used costumes and props from the owner, James' personal collection. At your appointed time, you meet your tour guide and are transported back to Stage 9 at Desilu Studios in 1966.

These set recreations were not meant to be the Enterprise as they thought it would appear as if it was actually in the 23rd century, but they are an accurate recreation of the original sets as they would have appeared on Stage 9 at Desilu Studios in 1966, complete with the open ceilings, set filming lights, etc. They paid amazing attention to detail, when building the sets, from finding or recreating actual building materials used in the 60's to taking fabric samples they found to a textile mill so they





could recreate the original fabrics used for decorations and bed linens in Captain Kirk's quarters set.

Our tour guide, Jennifer, had lots of background stories both about the building of the set tour, and about the creation of sets and props from the actual show in the 60's. SPOILER ALERT: If you don't want this spoiler, skip ahead. I will only give you this one story.



As you may or may not know, Star Trek was originally filmed on Stage 9 at Desilu studios which was owned by the legendary TV couple Desi Arnaz and Lucille Ball. In the conference room set on the Enterprise there are 2 flags in the corner that were hanging on flag poles and never unfurled. One of them was a Cuban flag with the addition of the UFP logo to honor Desi Arnaz's Cuban heritage.

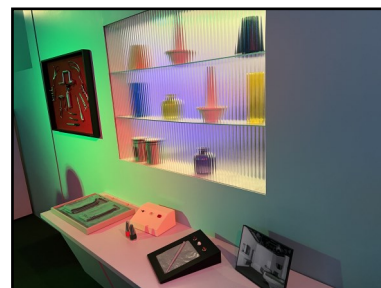


Some of the sets you see are the transporter room, corridors, sickbay and Dr. McCoy's office, Engineering, Captain Kirk's quarters, and the bridge.

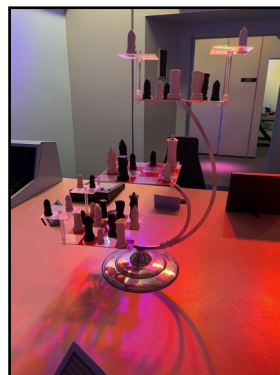
Some of my favorite things about the tour were that you are allowed to cosplay. Although you can't film due to Paramount rules, they do give you ample time to take as many still pics as you want.



And while they ask that you do not touch the majority of the set pieces and props, they do let you stand on the transporter and sit in the captain's chair for photo ops.
