





Paramount Merges with Skydance CHRIS POST



In a move that reshapes Hollywood's landscape, entertainment titan Paramount is merging with Skydance, marking the end of the Redstone family's significant era in the film industry. <u>According to reporting by the Associated Press</u>, this merger not only provides a much-needed financial boost to Paramount but also elevates David Ellison, Skydance's founder, as a key industry player.

Shari Redstone, who oversees National Amusements and controls the majority of Paramount's voting shares, has been the steadfast guardian of her father's legacy. Paramount, known for cinematic milestones like *Top Gun* and *The Godfather*, now faces the challenge of staying relevant in an evolving entertainment world. Despite initially rejecting a similar offer, Redstone agreed to the current deal, highlighting the necessity of fortifying Paramount's future.

"Given the changes in the industry, we want to fortify Paramount for the future while ensuring that content remains king," Redstone emphasized. The merger, valued at approximately \$28 billion, is set to conclude by September 2025, contingent on regulatory approval. An investment consortium led by the Ellison family and RedBird Capital will inject \$8 billion into the venture. Skydance, headquartered in Santa Monica, has been a crucial partner for Paramount, contributing to hits like *Top Gun: Maver-*

ick and the Mission Impossible film series.

David Ellison, who founded Skydance in 2010, will helm the new entity, New Paramount, as chairman and CEO. He outlined his vision in a recent conference call, emphasizing a "creative first" strategy and the need to integrate more technology into their operations. Ellison pointed out the success of tech giants in the media space and stressed the importance of a similar transformation for New Paramount.


"You've watched some incredibly powerful technology companies move into the media space and do so very successfully," Ellison stated. He also outlined plans to revamp the Paramount+ streaming service, aiming to boost user engagement and reduce churn, alongside adopting cloud-based production and generative AI for efficiency. Further restructuring was discussed, with Jeff Shell of RedBird Sports and Media identifying potential cost efficiencies amounting to \$2 billion. Despite the decline in linear TV growth, Shell emphasized the need to adapt and maintain this aspect of the business. This merger comes at a turbulent time for Paramount, which has faced difficulties maintaining its foothold. Earlier this year, a leadership shakeup saw CEO Bob Bakish replaced with a triumvirate of executives, and significant cost-cutting measures were introduced. Founded in 1914, Paramount boasts a storied history with classics like *Sunset Boulevard*, *The Godfather* and *Titanic*. Despite its recent struggles, the studio achieved notable success with *Top Gun: Maverick* in 2022, which grossed nearly \$1.5 billion worldwide, aiding the industry's recovery post-pandemic.

Yet, Paramount's theatrical releases have dwindled. Last year saw only eight new films, placing it fifth in the box office rankings. This year's slate remains modest, especially with *Mission: Impossible 8* delayed to 2025 due to industry strikes. Upcoming titles like *Bob Marley: One Love, A Quiet Place: Day One* and Ridley Scott's *Gladiator* sequel offer some promise.

The National Association of Theatre Owners expressed cautious optimism about the merger. Michael O'Leary, the association's president, voiced concerns about the potential reduction in theatrical releases, emphasizing the broad impact on the industry. Sumner Redstone, through National Amusements, built a media empire encompassing CBS and Viacom, which merged and separated multiple times, most recently reuniting in 2019 as Paramount Global. Under his leadership, Viacom became a media powerhouse with assets like MTV and Comedy Central.

Jonathan Frakes to Helm Sci-Fi Series ARTHUR C. CLARKE'S VE-NUS PRIME

Jonathan Frakes, best known for his iconic role in *Star Trek*, is set to direct the upcoming series *Arthur C. Clarke's Venus Prime*. This announcement comes with the added news that Frakes will also join the production team, promising a blend of his unique vision and sci-fi legacy.

According to reporting by Variety, the series has elevated writers David Cormican, known for *Tokyo Trial*, and Dwayne Hill of *Northern Rescue* fame to executive producers and show-runners. The six-episode series is scheduled to begin production in Canada by the end of this year, setting the stage for what promises to be a captivating adaptation.

"When the materials for Arthur C. Clarke's Venus Prime were presented to me, I couldn't help but devour them," Frakes said. "When asked if I wanted to direct what I read — my answer was a resounding and immediate 'Hell, yes!' Working on such a tremendous piece of IP from the mind of another sci-fi legend, who is also a contemporary of the true #1 Gene Roddenberry, will be both an honor and a dream for me."

The rights to the book series were secured by Claxson and Navajo from iBooks, an imprint of J. Boylston & Company. Adding to the authenticity and depth of the series, Arthur C.

Clarke's collaborator Paul Preuss will serve as a consultant, ensuring that the adaptation remains true to its literary roots.

This production is a collaborative effort, with Navajo Entertainment partnering with Claxson, Washington Square Entertainment, Palatin Media, Julijette, Karma Film, Fun Republic Pictures, and virtual production studio/film financier Volume Global. The series is poised to harness the combined strengths of these entities to deliver a high-quality viewing experience.

Series producers include Cormican, Anand Ramayya, and Juliette Hagopian, while executive producers Christopher Rush Harrington and Michael Hamilton-Wright from Volume Global, Roberto Vivo from Claxson, and Bernd Schlötterer of Palatin Media, bring their extensive expertise to the project.

Executive producer Lucas Vivo Garcia Lagos expressed his enthusiasm, stating, "Bringing Arthur C. Clarke's Venus Prime to audiences is a huge privilege and responsibility. These books, along with the incredible characters and storylines, have been with me since my adolescence; I have always believed this IP has all the necessary elements to become a major blockbuster. By uniting the collective talents of Preuss, Cormican, and Hill with Jonathan Frakes at the helm, we are confident we have assembled the perfect team to realize the cinematic vision we all share for this iconic property."

The deal for Frakes was negotiated by Paradigm's Babacar Diene, Bill Douglass, and Wilson Rubinoff, along with Fun Republic Pictures' Cormican. Palatin Media will handle international sales, excluding Latin America, which will be represented by Claxson.





1 large egg, beaten


1 teaspoon garlic salt

The Boeing Starliner might be coming home next month

Boeing's CST-100 Starliner, the spacecraft that has been stuck at the International Space Station for more than a month, might soon have a scheduled return date. NASA and the planemaker said that earthbound testing into the ship's problematic thruster systems have made it clear that final preparations can begin for the return portion of the mission as soon as next month.

"I'm very confident we have a good vehicle to bring the crew back with," said Mark Nappi, the Boeing executive overseeing the Starliner program, during a press conference.

The Starliner program is <u>more than a decade old</u>, and the craft was originally expected to be operational by 2015. And right when it was finally ready to take a crewed mission to space, helium leaks <u>repeatedly delayed its launch</u>. Those same leaks kept it from coming home.

Though the Starliner has plenty helium to complete a return trip, part of the problem is that its leakage issues can't be investigated


afterwards; the parts in question will burn up as they pass back into the Earth's atmosphere.

"With ground testing of a Reaction Control System (RCS) thruster complete and disassembly and inspections concluding, the Starliner team is reviewing data that will aid in future missions and pave the way for NASA astronauts Butch Wilmore and Suni Williams to return to Earth," the update reads. "A landing date for Starliner Crew Flight Test (CFT) will be scheduled following the Flight Test Readiness Review planned for later next week, while landing opportunities are available throughout August."

Mercury has a layer of diamond 10 miles thick, NASA spacecraft finds

NASA's MESSENGER mission has revealed that Mercury, the solar system's tiniest planet and the closest to the sun, hides a big secret.

The solar system's tiniest planet may be hiding a big secret. Using data from NASA's MESSENGER spacecraft, scientists have determined that a 10-mile-thick diamond mantle may lie beneath the crust of Mercury, the closest planet to the sun.


