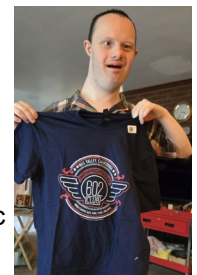
the same time zone as my crew. If possible I will join the zoom meeting again.

I hope you all had a great August.

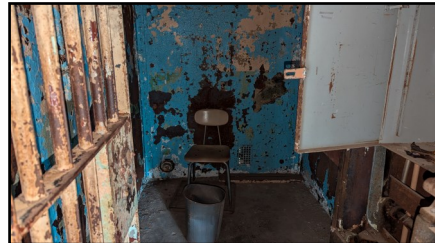
Hopefully this newsletter finds our fellow crewmate Vicki, has made a speedy and healthy recovery and to anyone else who may have been ill or under the weather in August.

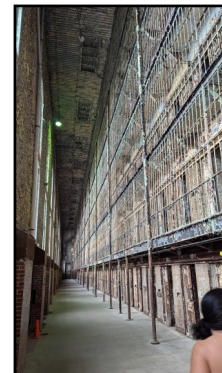
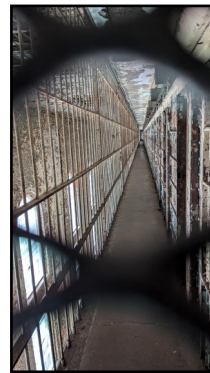
The cells were very small, dark and dingy. The number of cells, unreal, floor after floor and the rows on
